Domaine Parent was created in 1803 and is located in Pommard in the heart of Côte d'Or. Today it is run by Anne Parent and her sister Catherine Fages-Parent, representing the 12th generation, and perpetuating a family tradition dating back to the 17th century.

This now famous Domaine offers Premiers and Grands Crus, mainly red wines but also several exceptional and highly sought after white wines. Their wines have been fully certified organic (ECOCERT) since their 2013 vintage, and they also practice biodynamic cultivation methods though choose not to be certified.

Pommard has often been overlooked by many buyers as it does not have any Grand Cru vineyards. For savvy buyers this is a blessing as the world's obsession with Grand Cru continues to escalate, along with pricing. This is a brilliantly run small estate managed by the charismatic Anne Parent and her sister Catherine.

Anne Parent is a passionate vigneron, animated and with infectious enthusiasm. She is certainly not shy and retiring like so many Burgundian vignerons are in real life.

As you leave Beaune driving south, Pommard and Volnay stand out as two gorgeous villages nestled to your right. As you park up in Pommard, you cannot fail to immerse yourself in the history of this pretty village. A beautiful chocolate shop sits opposite the main square and Domaine Parent's cellar and office are a haven of tranquillity.

A tasting at the Domaine is a truly magical experience. Each wine simply delights. Tasting at Domaine Parent is always one of the highlights of Burgundy, with incredible consistency of concentration, polish, and elegance.

We highly recommend these wines. This is our 13th year of shipping from this classically old fashioned yet innovative Domaine. Anne Parent is respected as one of the key players in the village. The Domaine has enviable parcels and knows how to produce a great wine.

Corton Blanc Grand Cru 2022 Score: 92-94

The 2022 Corton Blanc Grand Cru, which legally could be labeled as Corton-Charlemagne, is matured entirely in new French oak with no lees-stirring. There is some reduction on the nose, and the oak will need to be integrated in bottle. The palate is medium-bodied with lovely balance, smooth in texture with almond, white peach and a creaminess from the oak. Very seductive, this will age with style. **Drinking Window: 2027 - 2047**

Monthélie Village 2022 Score: 88-90

The 2022 Monthelie Village comes from purchased fruit whereby Parent controls the harvest, raised in 350-liter barrels using 35% new oak. It has an uncomplicated nose with orange zest, and light peach skin touches. The palate is well-balanced with grapefruit and melon, quite pithy in style, with decent weight on the finish. Fine. Drinking Window: 2024 - 2034

Pommard Les Epenots ler Cru 2022 Score: 90-92

The 2022 Pommard Les Epenots ler Cru is a blend of the separately fermented Petit and Grands Epenots, about 50/50, 40% whole bunches and raised in 50% new French oak. The wood is just covering some of the fruit at the moment, so it will require some time to assimilate fully. The palate is medium-bodied with firm tannins and fine depth; maybe I'd have dialed that wood back a little on the finish, as it's a bit too chocolaty for my liking. Let's see how this matures in bottle. **Drinking Window: 2026 - 2042**

Pommard Les Argillieres ler Cru Score: 90-92

The 2022 Pommard Les Argillieres ler Cru has around 20% whole bunches and 35% new French oak. Parent described this as an understated cru that has a more intense finish. It has a well-defined, very pure bouquet, a mixture of red and blueberry fruit. Fine mineralite. The palate is medium-bodied with just a bit of oak to be assimilated, but good weight, fine-boned with a slightly savory finish. Perhaps a little earlier drinking than Parent's other cuvées. **Drinking Window: 2025 - 2040**

Corton les Renardes Grand Cru 2022 Score: 91-93

The 2022 Corton les Renardes Grand Cru is 100% whole bunches and 100% new French oak. It has a superb bouquet - you cannot tell the stems are here at all. Very floral with dried rose petals, a touch of lavender and pure red berry fruit. The palate is medium-bodied with fine, slightly chalky tannins. The oak is more prominent towards the finish and will require several years to assimilate fully. Drinking Window: 2028 - 2045

Ladoix La Corvee ler Cru 2022 Score: 90-92

The 2022 Ladoix La Corvee ler Cru, completely de-stemmed, has a perfumed, violet-tinged bouquet with a spring in its step. The medium-bodied palate has supple, fine tannins. It is fresh and vibrant, with a keen thread of acidity and a precise finish. This is a lovely Ladoix to enjoy over the next 12-to 15-years. Drinking Window: 2026 - 2038

Pommard La Croix Blanche 2022 Score: 90-92

The 2022 Pommard La Croix Blanche includes 10% whole bunches on the top of the vat. It has a delightful bouquet; those stems add a slight pepperiness. The 35% new oak is neatly integrated. The medium-bodied palate has pliant tannins and a little chewiness on the entry but decent weight with a pleasing sapidity on the finish. A bit rustic, but plenty of charm. Drinking Window: 2026 - 2036

Pommard Les Chanlins ler Cru 2022 Score: 91-93

The 2022 Pommard Les Chanlins ler Cru is around 20% whole bunches and 35% new oak. The fruit here is slightly darker than the Les Argillieres, with touches of brine coming through with aeration. The medium-bodied palate offers sappy red fruit and a fine backbone, powdery in texture with gentle grip on the black olive-tinged finish. You can feel the terroir here. **Drinking Window: 2026 - 2042**

Pommard Les Chaponnieres ler Cru 2022 Score: 91-93

The 2022 Pommard Les Chaponnieres ler Cru contains 30% whole bunches and was raised in 40% new French oak. The nose offers brambly red fruit, hints of graphite and an endearing sense of Pinote; this is more elegant than the Chanlins. The palate is medium-bodied with fine-grain tannins and fresh acidity. Again, a little powdery in texture with a long tail on the finish. Give this a couple of years in bottle. Drinking Window: 2026 - 2042

Monthelie Les Champs Fulliots ler Cru 2022 Score: 90-92

The 2022 Monthelie Les Champs Fulliots ler Cru comes from purchased fruit, although the Domaine controls the harvest, matured in less than 30% new oak. Pretty, pastille-like red and blueberry fruit on the nose, this is well-defined and comely. The medium-bodied palate has supple tannins and fine weight with succulent red fruit on the finish. Fine.
